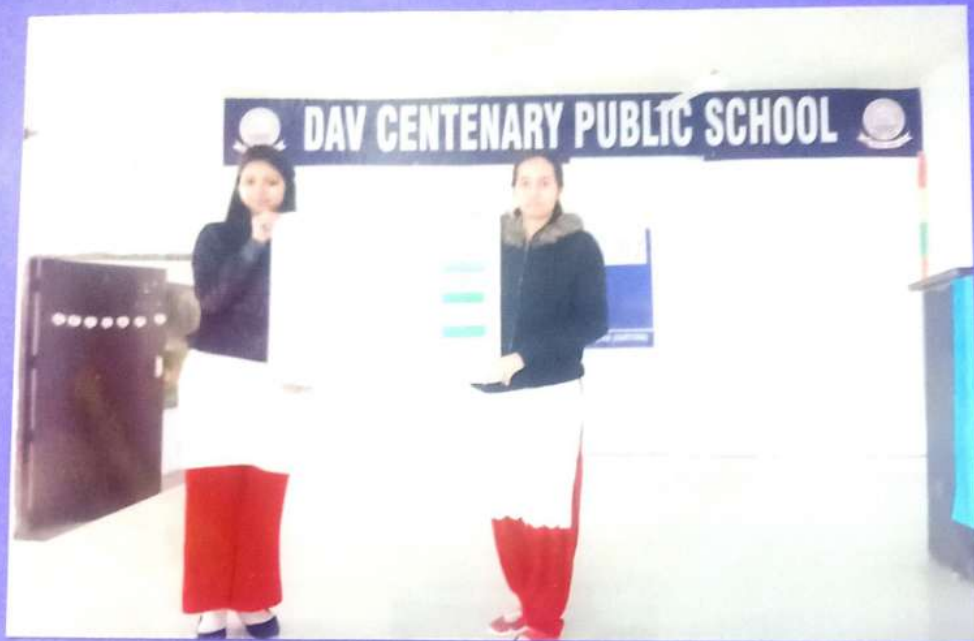
Then Ms. Neha showed posters to students which were made by all Pupil Teachers on the product, with the suitable taglines to give students the idea of creativity.

National Mathematics Day

Objectives:

- To instill awareness in students about the rich heritage of India in the field of education.
- To develop interest in young students about the often maligned and feared subject of Mathematics.
- To motivate aspiring mathematicians by focusing on great thinkers like Ramanujan and Aryabhata

On 132nd birth anniversary of great Indian mathematician Srinivas Ramanujan, a seminar cum interaction was conducted by pupil teachers of Dr. Ganesh Dass DAV College of Education for Women, Karnal, in Activity Hall of DAV Centenary Public School, Indri road, Karnal, on 24th December 2019. Ms. Sakshi Rani, Ms. Anjali, Ms. Komal, Ms. Reman, and Ms. Aakriti conducted the activity.

The event was initiated by a short speech on Ramanujan by Ms. Sakshi with emphasis on the fact that Ramanujan was a person with no formal education in Mathematics, yet he was successful in developing his own models and in fact gave the world about 3900 formulae independently. He was in fact hugely respected by mathematicians including GH Hardy of Cambridge University. He authenticated certain theorems and developed further theorems and formulae on his own.

The speech was followed by a short 12-minute documentary on Srinivas Ramanujan which was played by Ms. Komal. Students interest and amazement was seen to be believed. Ms. Reman thereafter conducted an interactive quiz on Ramanujan with enthusiastic participation from children who were duly rewarded for correct answers by prizes and we're applauded for their knowledge and effort.

Thereafter a quiz was conducted in 3 parts by Ms. Aakriti and Ms. Anjali. In first part, 3 questions related to Ramanujan were asked. In second part, students were shown different shapes and were asked to identify the shapes and write formulae for the same. Third part of the quiz consisted of certain mathematical questions related to Ramanujan.

It was indeed a joy to see such active participation from the students and high level of awareness displayed by them was commendable indeed.
